[Content of Job Information]: The Faculty of Regional Studies, Regional Culture Course, Prefectural University of Hiroshima invites applications for a full-time, tenured faculty position at the rank of Professor or Associate Professor or Lecturer, beginning April 2023.

The applicant must have a PhD or Master's Degree from either a Japanese or foreign university. He or she may be of any nationality but must be a native speaker of English Language and should have sufficient Japanese language proficiency to engage in normal faculty duties. Candidates with some teaching experience at the undergraduate as well as the graduate level is preferred.

The candidate's research focus should be in one (or more) of the following research areas: Cultural Studies, Multiculturalism, focusing on problems concerning gender, sexuality, ethnicity, diversity, intercultural communication, etc. Candidates with training in any of the following field are invited to apply: sociology, history, literature, linguistics, anthropology, education, psychology.

In addition to courses in the candidate's main area of research, teaching responsibilities also include teaching of English language classes, English seminars, and individual research guidance for graduation dissertations. The successful applicant may also teach students in the Master's Degree Program. He or she should be also willing to contribute to cooperation in solving regional/local problems.

[Courses to be taught (Undergraduate level)]: English Language and Communication, Research Seminar on English Language and Communication, Graduation Thesis Seminar I, II, Seminar in Solutions of Regional Problems I, II, Global Communication I, English Presentation I, II, Introduction to Multi-Cultural Studies II, etc.

[Courses to be taught (Graduate level)]: British and American Area Studies I, II, Special Seminar on British and American Area Studies.

- (6) A document that shows the applicant's address, phone number, FAX number and email address.

[Selection Process]:

The first round of selection will be based on application document screening. Applicants who pass the first round will be notified the date of an interview and asked to submit a lesson plan (syllabus) of the class (90 minutes x 15). In the interview, the applicants are asked to demonstrate the class based on the syllabus and make a speech about his or her aspiration at PUH. The second interview may be conducted, if necessary. (Depending on the COVID-19 problem, the interview may be conducted online and the demonstration of the class may be substituted by online submission of a 15 minutes movie.)
